ICARC Fox Hunts



I am your Fox Transmitter

I am here to make your life interesting (miserable).

Your Fox Hunt director spends all winter coming up with new ways to make your life as a fox hunter a living hell...

Just ask Emmet 😇





Prepare volatile materials.

Update **TOY** clock minimize time drift Check battery condition (listen on 144.150MHz) and replace if required Run *fox_label* utility generate new serial numbers for this hunt

Print serialized *fox_label_A_chk.pdf* sheet list of transmitter serial numbers

Print serialized *fox_label_C_FOX*.pdf* labels these are placed on individual transmitters

Print static material as needed this material is not serialized

Gather it all together (Antennas, Pens, blank cards, H.T.)

Signs (are signs even necessary???)

Make sure serialized *fox_label_C_FOX*.pdf* cards are rubber-banded to the matching transmitters!

Make sure serialized *fox_label_A_top.pdf* labels are affixed to their matching transmitters

Transmitter Deploy



Setting out the transmitter vector

Probably easiest to set them out in hunt groups. Tune your handheld tranceiver to 144.150MHz Install orange rubber-ducky antenna Turn on FOX TRANSMITTER on and verify battery condition (≥ 7.2V) Mark location with GPS or on paper map (it sucks to hunt the last transmitter at the end) Bring any transmitters showing a low battery back for replacement!

You can listen to the hunt group activity. Operating frequency listed on the serialized *fox check* sheet

Transmitters should not overlap

Formal Hunt Note:

The hunt groups may be configured to suppress transmitting before the advertised hunt start time.

This prevents obtaining a line-of-position in the parking lot!

Hunt Organizers Probably a single person will do this





Gather Participant Information

Keep at sign-in desk: fox_label_B_hunter.pdf Get name/callsign Note the start time

If the transmitters are quiet before the advertised start time, record the advertised start time. The hunters will not be able to start DF activities before they can hear the transmitter.

Hunter keeps this card: fox_label_B_cards.pdf

If there are adequate <code>fox_label_C_FOX*.pdf</code> cards with the transmitter, the hunter can simply pick a card up at the transmitter as proof of discovery. Otherwise they may record the ID/Serial field from the transmitter label on to their <code>fox_label_B_cards.pdf</code> card.





Let the hilarity begin!

Formal Hunt:

At the advertised start, the transmitters will begin transmitting. The hunters do not need to be corralled before the hunt starts, although they are free to stumble about aimlessly, keep them in the general area so they don't visually obtain a fix on the transmitters bright orange antenna!

Verbally announce that we are about to start a few minutes before the announced start time. Everyone should be able to catch the first message. Is your cellphone time accurate?

Informal Hunt:

The transmitters will begin transmitting when they are set out in the field. In this case, record the actual start time on the <code>fox_label_B_hunter.pdf</code> card.





Have your hunters done their homework?

Since you know where they are, and you have the answer key $(fox_label_A_chk.pdf)$ you don't get to be one of the hunters.

BUT

You do get to watch.

KC0JFQ is a devious bastard, and it's partially the fault of W0PPF (George suggested the fox transmitters should be able to talk). The fox transmitters have capabilities that should frustrate experienced hunters.





Have you done your homework? discipline!

Equipment:

Simple handheld Directional antenna TDOA antenna system Attenuator

Disciplined Hunting:

Operational Plan Typically **one minute** to obtain a *line of position* Map & clipboard to record what you find (multi color pencils?) Transmitters verbalize their **nickname** at the start of message traffic Beware **Multipath** (i.e. look for reflectors in the environment)

Hunters







Everyone has returned, allotted time for the hunt has elapsed

Record information:

Time IN on the fox_label_B_hunter.pdf card. Verify collected fox_label_C_FOX*.pdf cards Verify hand recorded ID/Serial on the fox_label_B_cards.pdf cards Calculate Time Delta on the fox_label_B_hunter.pdf card.

Calculate Standings:

Most *finds*. *finds/time* ??? Overtime Penalty ???

Collect our junk and go home

At this point, you've lost track of at least 3 transmitters. You may want to employ hunters to go out and help collect transmitters!

GPS waypoints as we deployed Well, just go collect them. Then you discover that tree cover sucks.

GPS track as we deployed

Makes a good backup for saving waypoints ('cause you'll forget a few at the end) Can we just walk the track?

You forgot, didn't you!

Doh!, I hope you brought your TDOA antenna. I hope you're not picking up after an interleaved hunt group.
